

# 5<sup>th</sup> Grade Summer Reading Assignment 2017



*Students will need to read Number the Stars by Lois Lowry.*

After reading the novel, you will create a character analysis poster to reflect how **one** of the character's emotions changed as a result of events or situations that took place throughout the story (cause and effect).

Follow the guidelines below:

1. Select one of the main characters to analyze.
2. Using a horizontal (landscape) format on a 12 in. X 18 in. light colored piece of construction paper, write the name and author of the book along with the name of the character you are analyzing on the top edge of the paper (about 1 inch high) - Template example on back.
3. Divide the remaining area of the paper into eight equal size boxes (you may fold the paper to make it easy)
4. For each of the eight boxes, cut out a picture from a magazine that reflects an emotion that you can infer that the character was feeling during the story. The pictures you select do not need to look like the character, but they need to reflect the emotion that the character was feeling. You can even use pictures of animals for human characters (and visa versa) as long as the pictures represent the emotion.
5. Under the picture, write a sentence to describe what caused the character to have that emotion. Highlight the emotion word in the sentence. It is recommended to write the sentence in pencil first and then trace over it with colored pencil or thin markers once you are sure that the sentence is grammatically correct, all words are spelled correctly, and it looks neat.
6. The emotions should be placed in the boxes in the sequence (order) in which they were felt during the story. To make this task easier, it is recommended that you take short notes about each chapter as you are reading.
7. You may use one emotion two times, but the other six boxes should have different emotions. (synonyms: happy and glad - count as the same emotion).
